

2019 President's Cup Tournament (Satellite)

April 1 – October 15, 2019

Rules

I. Open to all current Los Verdes Men's Club members with a current SCGA index. Tournament entrance fee must be paid prior to playing the first round.

II. Format

- 1. 54-hole net stroke play total score
- 2. Play the 3 rounds between April 1 and September 30, 2019
- 3. Only 1 round per calendar month may be submitted, with no make-up rounds for missed months
- 4. Rounds can be played from either the Blue or White moveable tees
- 5. Scoring is low net using current 3-month low index
- 6. Final score is the total of all 3 net rounds
- 7. Rounds can be played concurrently with any other tournament or club activity round in which you play your own ball, and are playing with another Los Verdes Men's Club member who must attest your scorecard

III. Prior to Your President's Cup Round

- 1. Enter your name, date of play, and current 3-month-low index or the Los Verdes Men's Club tournament handicap (if in use by the club) on the President's Cup sign-in page in the Satellite Tournament notebook (SCGA index is updated on the 1st and 15th of each month).
- 2. Note the number on the line you completed and take the pre-numbered scorecard with the same number for your round
- 3. Enter your name and date played on the score card and indicate Blue or White tees played
- 4. You must declare to your Los Verdes Men's Club group member(s) that you are playing a President's Cup round before you tee off on the first hole

IV. Scoring the Round

- 1. Record your gross score on each hole.
- 2. Total your gross score and subtract your handicap strokes to get your 18-hole net score.
- 3. Any hole played with a temporary green or temporary tee must be scored as Par Plus (also called Net Par, which equals par for the whole plus any handicap strokes for that hole; par 4 + 1 handicap stroke = 5)

V. After the Round

- 1. Make sure you pre-numbered score card is completed: name, date, tees played, current 3-month-low handicap, and gross scores
- 2. Sign your card and get the attesting member to sign the card
- 3. Enter the attesting member's name on the President's Cup sign-in page
- 4. Deposit the completed scorecard in the GREY/BEIGE BOX in the pro shop/locker room; *DO NOT PUT THE CARD IN THE RED BOX!*
- 5. Post as a Home Score (unless playing in an official LVMC tournament)

VI. Standings During the Tournament

- 1. The number of flights will be determined by dividing the total number of players by 7, with a maximum number of 4 flights. For example, 25 players divided by 7 = 3.5, which would mean 3 flights. If the number of players is 28 or higher, there will be 4 flights.
- 2. Flight assignment will be determined by dividing the total number of players by 4, then grouping players by handicap range. Players will assigned to a flight based on the 3-month-low index of April 1. Grouping may result in slightly unequal number of players in some flights.
- 3. The President's Cup captain will send out the standings via e-mail to all those playing at the beginning of the months of May, June, July, August, and September. The final standings will be sent out via e-mail to all players in early October.

VI. President's Cup Champion

- 1. The winner of each flight will be the combined lowest net scores of all three rounds.
- 2. In case of ties in a flight, we are going to use the back 9 totals, then front 9 totals, then hole-by-hole comparison, then low-net round to determine the flight winner.
- 3. The winner of each flight will play in the President's Cup Championship in October on a date to be determined by the winners' availability, with green fees paid for by the club
- 4. The President's Cup Championship, played from the <u>White PERMANENT tees</u>, is an 18-hole net-score format and the President's Cup champion will be the player with the lowest net score.
- 5. In the case of a tie, the tie-breaking system in VI-2 above will be used.
- 6. The President's Cup captain or a designated LVMC member will serve as a "marshall" for the Championship round to assist with scoring and with rulings on special circumstances (drops, lost ball, putting rotation, etc.)
- 7. The winner of the President's Cup Championship will be recognized by the LVMC as the President's Cup Champion for 2019
- 8. Payouts are determined by the President's Cup captain for the flight winners, the Championship winner, and players finishing 2nd, 3rd, and possibly 4th in their flights. The amount of the payouts is determined by the amount of money available for the tournament.

Failure to follow the President's Cup rules or the SCGA rules of golf results in round disqualification. Purposeful violation of these rules results in tournament disqualification.
